The 'Great Dictator' is a 1940's American political satire comedy drama written, directed, produced and starred by the British comedian actor Charlie Chaplin. This was the first sound film made by Chaplin. The film strongly condemns Adolf Hitler, Benito Mussolini and their political philosophy of Nazism & Fascism.In the movie Charlie Chaplin plays two roles: One that of a Jewish Barber and the other that of Adolf Hitler. Both look the same and this likeness leads to a case of mistaken identity and the Jewish Barber is treated as the despotic dictator for some time by the German army and people. At the end of the movie Chaplin in the role of the despotic ruler, gives an impassioned speech about the need to throw out despots and dictators and the need to bring in democracy all over the world.

This speech is what the undergraduate students of 3rd semester have to study.Chaplin in his speech says that men should use the power of democracy to change the world, where all men will have equal rights and chance to work for a better life and the chance to create a better world. A World, where people will have everything they want. A world, where everyone will be free and happy! That is Chaplin's vision of a new brave world order, where democracy shall reignsupreme.

Details of the Event: A Motivational Talk on the Topic, 'The Story of the Chinese Bamboo'. A motivational talk on the topic, 'The Story of the Chinese Bamboo', was conducted on 16 June 2021 by Shri John Joseph Panakkal, hod, Department of English, MTM College. The parable of the Chinese Bamboo Tree teaches us lessons about patience, faith, perseverance, growth and development and importantly... human potential! Like any plant, to

flourish the Chinese Bamboo Tree requires nurturing – water, fertile soil, Sunshine. In the first year, there are no visible signs of activity or development. In the second year, again, no growth above the soil. And the third and fourth, still no signs.Patience is tested and we begin to wonder if our efforts will ever be rewarded.

Finally in the fifth year – voila! There is growth...and what growth it is! The Chinese Bamboo Tree grows 80 feet (nearly 30m) in just six weeks! So the question is: Does the Chinese Bamboo Tree really grow 80 feet in six weeks? Did it lie dormant for fouryears only to grow exponentially in the fifth? Or, was the little tree growing underground, developing a root system and a stable base strong enough to support its potential for outward growth in the fifth year and beyond?

If the tree had not developed a strong unseen foundation, it could not have sustained its life as it grew. Just as a house needs to have a strong foundation to survive. The same principle is true for people, success and your speaking career. People, toil towards their dreams and goals, building strong character while overcoming adversity and challenge, grow the strong internal foundation to handle success, while those who chase the "quick buck" are unable to sustain unearned sudden wealth. Remember the old saying: "Out of adversity comes opportunity."

Had the farmer dug up his little seed every year to see if it was growing, he would have stunted the Chinese Bamboo tree's growth as surely as a fledgling bird is doomed if it is freed from its struggle of breaking through the shell prematurely. The struggle in the egg is what gives the little bird the strength to grow and flourish, just as tension against muscles as we exercise strengthen our muscles, while muscles left alone will soon atrophy.

The Chinese Bamboo Tree is a perfect parable to our own experience with personal growth and change. And change is never easy. Often, signs of progress are slow, frustrating and unrewarding at times. But it is so worth it....especially if we can be patient and persistent. A motivational talk on the topic, 'The Old Man and the Sea', was conducted as part of Reading Day Celebration in the College, on 19 June 2021 by Shri John Joseph Panakkal, hod, Department of English, MTM College.

Old Man and the Sea is a Nobel Prize winning work by Ernest Hemingway, the mostpopular macho fiction writer and American author of the 20th Century. The story is all about an old man; Santiago, an aging, experienced fisherman who has gone eighty-four days without catching a fish. He is now seen as "salao," the worst form of unlucky. Manolin, a young man whom Santiago has trained since childhood, has been forced by his parents to work on a luckier boat. Manolin remains dedicated to Santiago, visiting his shack each night, hauling his fishing gear, preparing food, and talking about American baseball and Santiago's favorite player, Joe dimaggio. Santiago says that tomorrow, he will venture far out into the Gulf Stream, north of Cuba in the Straits of Florida to fish, confident that his unlucky streak is near its end.

On the eighty-fifth day of his unlucky streak, Santiago takes his skiff out early. By noon, he has hooked a big fish that he is sure is a marlin, but he is unable to haul it in. He is unwilling to tie the line to the boat for fear that a sudden jerk from the fish would break the line. With his back, shoulders, and hands, he holds the line for two days and nights. He gives slack as needed while the marlin pulls him far from land. He uses his other hooks to catch fish and a dolphin to eat. The line cuts his hands, his body is sore, and he sleeps little. Despite this, he expresses compassion and appreciation for the marlin, often referring to him as a brother. He determines that no one is worthy enough to eat the marlin.

On the third day, the fatigued marlin begins to circle the skiff. Santiago, almost delirious, draws the line inward, bringing the marlin towards the boat. He pulls the marlin onto its side and stabs it with a harpoon, killing it. Seeing that the fish is too large to fit in the skiff, Santiago lashes it to the side of his boat. He sets sail for home, thinking of the high price the fish will bring him at the market and how many people he will feed.

The trail of blood from the dead marlin attracts sharks. Santiago berates himself for having gone out too far. He kills a great mako shark with his harpoon but loses the weapon. He makes a spear by strapping his knife to the end of an oar. He kills three more sharks before the blade of the knife snaps, and he clubs two more sharks into submission. But each shark has bitten the great marlin, increasing the flow of blood. That night, an entire school of sharks arrives. Santiago attempts to beat them back. When the oar breaks, Santiago rips out the skiff's tiller and continues fighting. Upon seeing a shark attempt to eat the marlin's head, Santiago realizes the fish has been completely devoured. He tells the sharks they have killed his dreams.

Santiago reaches shore before dawn the next day. He struggles to his shack, leaving the fish head and skeleton with his boat. Once home, he falls into a deep sleep. Before that Santiago declares that in spite of all the trouble, he shall go fishing the next day. The story proclaims the world famous quote "Man can be destroyed but not defeated", which off course means that it is impossible to defeat the will power of a dedicated human being. The motivation lecture was intended to give the young minds the message that you are not defeated unless you decide that you aredefeated.

A motivational talk on the topic, 'The Marshmallow Test', was conducted on 30 June 2021 by Shri John Joseph Panakkal, hod, Department of English, MTM College.Original Stanford experiment in delayed gratification was conducted by Walter Mischel at Stanford University in 1970.The purpose of the study was to understand when the control of delayed gratification, the ability to wait to obtain something that one wants, develops in children.

Most of the research conducted during that time was done with delayed rewards in areas such as time perspective and the delay of rewards, resistance to temptation, and psychological disturbances.Not many studies had been conducted in the area of human social behaviour. The authors hypothesized that an increased salience of a reward would in turn increase the amount of time children would be able to delay gratification (or wait).

Since the rewards were presented in front of them, children were reminded of why they were waiting. The attention on the reward (that was right in front of them) was supposed to make them wait longer (for the larger reward). It was assumed that the children who could wait for their reward patiently would better in life.Some of the continuous evaluation proved this theory to be somewhat correct in that most children who waited patiently for their rewards became very successful in life. Later studies showed that apart from this there are various other factors that decide nthe future outcome of children.

A Bridge Course in Communicative English was provided to students of various department of the MTM College from 11 October to 15 October 2021. Around 100 students participated in the programme.Course Description: The course aimed at training the participants to improve their English language skills, refine their communicative ability and fine tune their personality.

Necessity of the Course It may sound simple: say what you mean. But all too often, the intended message we try to deliver gets lost in translation despite our best intentions. We say one thing, our audience hears something else. Communication is more than just exchanging information. It is about understanding the emotion and intentions behind the information. It is not only how you communicate a message, it helps to deepen your connections to others and improve teamwork, decision making, and problem solving. Effective communication enables you to communicate even negative or difficult messages without creating conflict or destroying trust. Objectives: The prime objectives of this course areTo acquaint the learners with ideas related to creative writing including the art, the craft and the basic skills required for a creative writer. To help learners to understand the principles of creative writing and the distinction between the literary genres. To explain the differences in writing for various literary and social media. To hone the creative and critical faculties of learners. To enable learners to put into practice the various forms of creative writing that they have studied through the course.
