The following programs are conducted by IT Club during the year 2023-2024

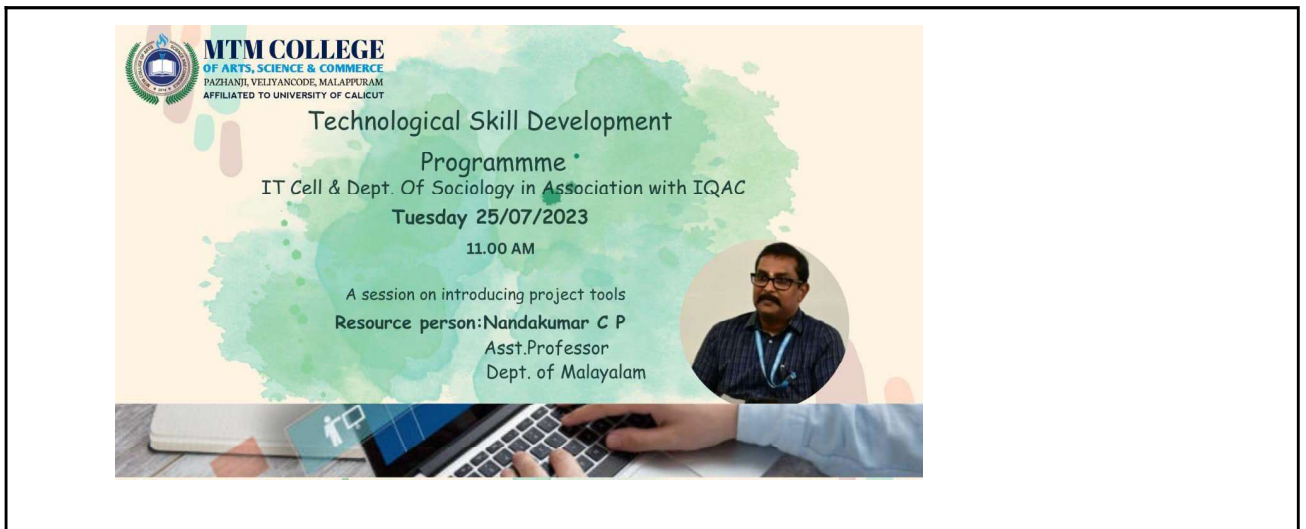
### **1) Technology Skill Development Program**
