For this reason most blood is collected by blood centers, rather than hospitals.

As a small step to this, NSS Unit of MTM College Veliyankode has started a Blood Donars Club; maximum support from the part of students' can be seen through their participation.



World No Tobacco Day

Adolescents are more likely to initiate tobacco use if they lack the awareness of tobacco and related industry tactics deliberately employed to hook them on nicotine and tobacco products and if they lack the skills to say no to nicotine and tobacco.

Adolescents may try some form of tobacco or nicotine products when offered as a result of direct peer pressure, influenced by advertising, promotion and sponsorship, or simply as a result of not being equipped with the knowledge or skills to refuse it. So giving our target audience (NSS Students') the opportunity to expose industry tactics observed in their community, practice the act of refusing tobacco products, shisha or e-cigarettes in a safe environment using an entertaining medium, and develop advocacy plans for rejecting industry manipulation and creating a tobacco-free generation.

With this objective NSS Unit of MTM College, in accordance with World No Tobacco Day (WNTD), convened an evening seminar on May 29th Saturday 2021, aimed to create a future direction for tobacco countermeasure.
